

KNIGHTS AND LADIES OF MARSHALL, EASTERN REGION, VISIT S.O.S VILLAGE AT ASIAKWA

As part of the celebration of this year's Marshallan Day, the Eastern Regional Council and Court of the Knights and Ladies of Marshall visited the S.O.S village at Asiakwa on Saturday 1st May 2010 and donated cash of five hundred Ghana cedis (GH¢ 500.00) and assorted items worth one thousand, five hundred Ghana cedis (GH¢ 1,500.00). The items included soft drinks, biscuits, rice, provisions, detergent and other toiletry items.

The mothers' representative at the village, Madam Getrude Boakye received brothers and sisters of the Noble Order and welcomed them on behalf of the Director and the mothers of the S.O.S village. She gave a brief history of the establishment of the village, the role and functions of the mothers at the village. She said there are fourteen (14) mothers (4 on training) at the village taking care of about one hundred (100) children mostly orphans and abandoned children. Every mother has about eight to ten (8-10) children.

The Regional Noble Lady, RL sister Gloria Bramson introduced officers, Grand Knights and Noble Ladies of the constituent councils and courts of the Noble Order in the region.

The Regional Grand Knight, W/Bro. Charles Kwame Appiasi gave a brief history of the Order which he said is a catholic friendly society started by thirteen (13) brothers at Sekondi in the Western region about eighty-four (84yrs) years ago. He also said the society helps members to enhance their spiritual development in the Catholic Church and helps groups of people and organisations in need. He finally said one of our main objectives is to do charity work for the needy in society, hence the visit of the Regional Council and Court to the village.

The children entertained the marshallans to some traditional music and dance. The mothers finally took the marshallans round their homes and explained their routine work towards the upkeep of the children under their care.
